Grant will help fund educational activities to benefit more than 1,000 children

Now in its eleventh year, the award is a partnership between the Goldman Sachs 10,000 Women program and *Fortune*. It is given to outstanding women from around the world who are creating social impact projects to empower others in their communities and countries.

"The introduction of STEM programs to young refugee women in Greece has the potential to make a real and lasting impact on people's lives," said Solomon. "The work Aleksandra is spearheading exemplifies global leadership in business and beyond."

"Aleksandra is an example of how we can each use our skills to give back in our communities and the world, which is what the Global Women Leaders Award is all about," said Leigh Gallagher, senior editor at large, *Fortune*.

Gren, a past participant and alumni in the *Fortune*-U.S. State Department Mentoring Partnership program, has been active in empowering women in finance and technology, which led to her involvement in promoting STEM education programs to refugees internationally.

"Through personal experience and my work in financial services technology at Fiserv, I have seen what a powerful enabler STEM education is for women," said Gren. "Introducing girls in refugee camps to computer programming and coding enables them to take positive steps to build their own futures."
